# Joint Commission Accreditation Completed—River Garden Recognized for Excellence

After nearly one year of planning and preparation, River Garden Hebrew Home announced on October 10, 2018 that it has earned The Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval® for Nursing Care Center Accreditation and Post-Acute Care Certification. The Gold Seal of Approval® is a symbol of quality that reflects an organization's commitment to providing safe and effective patient and resident care. It is earned by demonstrating continuous compliance with established performance standards.

River Garden underwent a rigorous on-site survey August 28-30, 2018. During the review, Joint Commission expert surveyors evaluated compliance with nursing care center standards related to several areas, including assistance with activities of daily living, coordination of care, and staff education and training. Surveyors also conducted on-site observations and interviews with leaders and staff of the organization.

Mauri Mizrahi, Associate Administrator at River Garden, championed the certification project. She says, "Our Director of Nursing and clinical care team are critical to our success. It is a pleasure to work with staff from who continue to work together to develop and implement strategies that improve care for our patients and residents." As an eight-time recipient of the Governor's Gold Seal Award for Excellence in Long-Term Care, River Garden is well known for top-rated senior care.

"River Garden is delighted to receive accreditation and certification from The Joint Commission, the premier health care quality improvement and accrediting body in the nation. Along with our other awards, Joint Commission accreditation serves as validation of the excellence of our programs, and it is a testament to the ongoing support of the Jacksonville Jewish community," adds Martin A. Goetz, Chief Executive Officer.

Established in 1966, The Joint Commission's Nursing Care Center Accreditation Program accredits organizations from across the country that offer nursing and other long term care services. The Post-Acute Care Certification award was launched in 2013 by The Joint Commission to recognize nursing homes that demonstrate advanced competencies in the provision of post-acute care to patients and residents recently hospitalized. Only fourteen (14) other care centers in Florida match the level of

accreditation earned by River Garden Hebrew Home.

The accreditation and certification programs are awarded for a three-year period.



# Honoring Our Jewish Traditions

At our "Jewish Book of Why" program in early September, we enjoyed an interactive discussion about the customs of the Jewish New Year. Symbolic foods were served as we made a blessing on each one. Fond memories were evoked as we spoke about our traditions.

Some of the foods that we tasted and discussed included:

Honey (of course!)

How better to wish for a Shana Tova U'Metukah -- a good and sweet new year -- than to eat one of nature's sweetest foods?

Pomegranates

Just as the fruits are full of seeds, we hope we'll be similarly

full of merits in the coming year.

Carrots (Gezer)

Hebrew word for decree. Eating carrots on Rosh Hashanah is meant to express our desire that G-d will nullify any negative decrees against us. Interestingly, the Yiddish words for 'carrots' and 'more' -- mern and mer, respectively -- are strikingly similar. So among Yiddish speakers, carrots symbolize the

The Hebrew word for carrot sounds very much like *g'zar*, the

desire for blessings in the new year.

Beets

The Hebrew word for beets, *selek*, is similar to the word for 'remove.' Beets are eaten to express the hope that our enemies

will depart.

Gefilte Fish

The notion that fish are ever-vigilant and swim constantly is linked to this symbolic food and reflects the desire to be constantly aware of G-d and of opportunities to do good.






# High Holiday Service for Our Memory Care Families

The doors of the Adult Day program and the support group are always open. Talking through the circumstances and learning about available resources may help.

At River Garden, excellent care and faith-based values are at the heart of all that we do. That's what motivated Leslie Held, Director of Jewish Life and Volunteer Services, to plan an inaugural event. On Sunday, September 16, Held hosted a unique High Holiday service specifically for those with dementia and their families to celebrate the New Year.

Held says, "So much of who we are as a person is rooted in our faith; the traditions, prayers and songs are like a part of our soul. Our goal was to create a respectful and dignified holy service so that those who may feel isolated from the community of faith would have a real, genuine opportunity for High Holiday worship."

Every experience dealing with dementia is different, and many facing this difficult disease have specific needs due to the condition. The disease often creates a set of symptoms that make social engagements challenging. In addition to cognitive or physical impairment, people living with dementia may have a heightened sense of emotions and may suffer from hallucinations or delusions. They may also have language difficulties, visual challenges and surprising behavior. Families may withdraw or isolate themselves because of embarrassment. Or, it might just be easier to stay at home, minimizing the risk of 'something bad' happening in public.

"Throughout the Jewish community, we are continually striving to find new ways to support those who are living with the challenges of dementia. Our special 45-minute service focused on familiar music and prayers to stimulate memory and create a relaxed, accepting environment. We're glad so many were able to attend," Held says.




Cultural Arts event November 1-15, 2018. Specifically, Agronin's talk will be on Monday, November 12 at 7:00 PM.

Effective October 1st, River Garden began using PassPort<sup>TM</sup>, a fully automated, constantly monitored, pharmacy dispensing system that packages medication in both single and multi-dose envelopes by resident and room number. The PassPort<sup>TM</sup> provides incredible nursing efficiency, increases medication accuracy, reduces medication waste and reduces cost to all payers. We think it is the most technologically sophisticated, fully integrated and cost-effective in-house pharmacy platform for the safe management of medication in sub-acute nursing environment.

CEO Marty Goetz shares, "Taking the step to close our pharmacy has not been easy for me, but I know that this type of innovation is moving our agency in the right direction. One main goal is to enable our nurses to spend more time on direct patient care and less on med pass, med destruction, and other routine functions."

Partners Pharmacy, a company based out of central Florida, owns the equipment. The system is monitored visually and diagnostically 24/7 via their oncall pharmacy team.

The PassPort<sup>TM</sup> provides a variety of workflow efficiencies, some of which the care team is still adjusting to. Betty Sorna, CFO, is keen to recognize the financial benefits. She says, "This technology enables us to contain

our medication costs without compromising outcomes."



# River Garden Auxiliary Presents Contemporary 'Remakes' of Classic Films in Their Calendar




